The role will also support delivery of business training workshops.

MAIN PURPOSE OF JOB:

The core of the role is to deliver one-to-one coaching to craft and creative businesses, principally individual practitioners and sole traders, based both at Cockpit's studios and outside. The role will also support delivery of business training workshops.

MAIN DUTIES:

- 1. Provide one-to-one coaching to up to 40 makers, helping them identify and develop a sustainable model for their business or practice.
- 2. Contribute to the development of resources including worksheets, training materials, and online content.
- 3. Support existing partnerships with craft, design, higher education, and enterprise organisations and individuals.
- 4. Provide occasional information, advice and guidance by telephone or email.
- 5. Represent Cockpit externally as required.
- 6. Deliver work in accordance with Cockpit's Diversity and Inclusion Policy.
- 7. Undertake any other duties associated with business incubation as required by the Head of Business Incubation or CEO.

PERSON SPECIFICATION

Essential knowledge, skills and experience

- Knowledge and understanding of steps in starting and growing a successful business (e.g. developing a business plan and marketing plan, costing and pricing, export and employment, working with suppliers and retailers)
- Knowledge of the challenges that can face creative people in developing their practice or business and how to overcome those barriers
- Knowledge of the creative industries



- At least three years' experience as a business coach or trainer working with microenterprises
- Ability to identify training, business and professional development needs and appropriate support and resources to meet those needs
- Excellent organisational and administrative skills, including meticulous record-keeping or report-writing
- Strong IT skills (Microsoft Office: Word, Excel, Outlook, PowerPoint, Teams, Zoom)

- A relevant degree or professional qualification in the creative industries and or enterprise

- Knowledge or experience of the craft and design field
